### I. Minutes of May 8, 2024 CCPC Meeting

- a. Due to issues with the email list, not all committee members received the draft minutes in time to review before the meeting; minutes were preliminarily approved to be confirmed at next meeting
- b. Kelley will put together an email list to send to the group to make sure all emails are correct/updated
- c. Kelley to make sure all minutes are posted to Town's website

### II. Developments Since Last Meeting

- a. Discussed Callnan Memo (dated May 22)
  - i. Provides schedule to set new default rates
  - ii. Eversource and Unitil rates for August 1, 2024 January 31, 2025 will be released by Friday, June 14
  - iii. We will not know until June 27 what the 5 rates offered by CPCNH will be
  - iv. Select Board Meeting is on June 17, so the Selectboard will have to pass a conditional rate approval

- v. Canterbury Newsletter for July CCPC will have some information about amount saved for Canterbury residents, but will not know the final rates in time for the July newsletter
- vi. Clifton Mathieu discussed transparency, and noted that Canterbury Community Power rates do not save residents money on the utility's delivery fee; Clifton noted that this should be made clear in the newsletter
- vii. Howard Moffett discussed that the utility's distribution rates might go up, but this is a regulatory process, separate from CPC or CPCNH, and we do not have any control over the distribution rates

# **b.** Discussed adding a 5<sup>th</sup> rate option for Canterbury:

- i. "Canterbury Basic" this would be a discretionary reserve adder rate option
- ii. Note that this is different from Canterbury's allocated share of CPCNH reserves
- iii. Could present to Select Board that CCPC recommends Granite Basic OR Canterbury Basic as the default rate
- iv. Individuals would still be able to choose any rate, including Granite Basic, for their household
- v. Consensus that CCPC will go to Select Board with both options

# c. Update on HB 1600

- i. Unfortunately, HB 1600 will not pass this session
- ii. This in part means that CCPC/CPCNH will remain limited to what we can offer net-metering folks

# III. Discussed a New Funding project by NH Department of Energy

- a. Opportunity for funding for a municipal solar generating project
- b. Proposals due August 1
- c. Unlikely CCPC could prepare a proposal by that deadline, but all the more reason to be ready for a future opportunity

### IV. Discussed June 3 Merrimack Members Project Meeting (handout)

- a. A number of Merrimack County member towns showed interest in a multi-town project
- b. CPCNH is looking at 3 different kinds of renewable energy generation projects:
  - i. Single town projects CCPC has been exploring this route, despite efforts we have not been successful in finding ideal location in Canterbury
  - ii. Multi-town project could involve several other CPCNH member towns in Merrimack County – would not matter in what town the project is sited,

all towns in the group would benefit (this would also depend on which utility is involved, and if that utility serves Canterbury residents)

- iii. CPCNH project sponsored, developed, and shared out by CPCNH to benefit all CPCNH member towns
- c. Discussion regarding potential for Planning Board goals for Canterbury
  - i. For example, Concord has 100% renewable energy goal by 2030; Loudon sets aside \$30k in its budget each year for renewable energy projects
